2018 Joseph Strauss Reunion

Annapolis, Maryland

Wednesday, October 24 – Sunday, October 28, 2018



Shipmates, Spouses and Guests---Get set to join us this October for another spectacular reunion. destination is Annapolis --- Home of the US Naval Academy. Our hosts, Bob and Leona Wilson, have put together an exciting reunion plan and have negotiated an outstanding hotel rate in an area noted for very high costs. Our hotel rate is good 3 days before and after the reunion dates. Bob says "Come Early – Stay Late". It is expected that many shipmates will make use of the hotel to do some site-seeing in the DC area as there are so many things to see and do. Some suggestions include:

- Visit the Udvar Hazy Center Air & Space Museum in Chantilly VA near the Dulles Airport with exhibits including the Space Shuttle Discovery, the Enola Gay, an SR-71 Blackbird, SST Concorde, and a Wright Brothers replica, tons of other airplanes from all of the wars and commercial aviation, and a replica of the Standard Missile-3 that shot down the satellite in 2008
- Visit the U.S. Navy Memorial, the National Mall area or Arlington National Cemetery.
- Visit the National Aquarium at the Baltimore Inner Harbor
- Visit the Smithsonian

TRANSPORTATION

Baltimore Washington International Airport (BWI) – BWI is the suggested airport to arrive at this reunion as it is only 3 miles to the hotel. You might consider Reagan and Dulles airports and renting a car if you find better air fares into those locations. Free shuttle services at BWI are provided to and from the reunion hotel, just call the hotel.

HOTEL

We are staying at The Westin at BWI Airport. The Westin Hotel is located at 1110 Old Elkridge

Landing Rd, Linthicum Heights, MD 21090. Their Phone number is: (443) 577-2300. Check in time is at 3 pm & Check out time is at 12pm. Our reunion rate is \$115 per night plus tax. The rate includes Breakfast every morning (6 to 9 am) with an Omelet station on Thursday and Friday. The Hotel will be providing a 1 hour bar food, beer, wine & soda Welcome Reception on October 24 for all registered Strauss guests. Hotel reservations must be made by the



cut off date of Sep 26, 2018. REUNION TOURS

Thursday, October 25, 0745-1530 – US Naval Academy Day

Book Early! – This tour is limited to <u>maximum of 94 guests</u>; so first-come, first-served for this one! Meet in the Lobby at 0745. Buses depart The Westin at 0800 for the U.S. Naval Academy where we will enter the gate through **metal detectors** and enjoy about one half hour for shopping at the Academy Gift Shop. Then we will see a movie about the Academy followed by about an hour and a half walking tour that will include John Paul Jones' Crypt; Admiral Strauss' Academy Class Ring; the Capt John Ripley's diorama of his destruction of the bridge at Dong



Ha where the Strauss provided naval gunfire support; the Noon Formation at Bancroft Hall and many other things. For those who don't want to take the walking tour, you will be able to wait at the reception building and take a virtual tour and then walk to the Noon

Formation and rejoin the group. At 1230 we will leave the Academy and go to the Annapolis harbor (about 2 blocks) and board the Annapolis Harbor Queen. The ship will depart at 1300 (1 pm) and we will enjoy lunch on the Harbor Queen. Lunch will be catered by the Mission BBQ which is veteran owned, has outstanding BBQ and a part of their profits go to the Wounded Warrior Project. Aboard the Harbor Queen we will see the outside of the Naval Academy, Annapolis Harbor and the surrounding Severn River area. The buses will pick us up at 1500 (3 pm) and return us to the Westin Hotel.

Thursday, October 25 – Evening (Joan's Dinner)

This is an impromptu no host group dinner at a local eatery arranged by Joan Halfman. Each year Joan continues to surprise us with the choice of restaurant. THANK YOU Joan from all of us for doing this. Please indicate on the registration form if you plan to attend.

Friday, October 26, 0845-1630 – Fort McHenry and Baltimore Inner Harbor Day

Meet in the Lobby at 0730. Buses depart The Westin at 0745 for Fort McHenry where we will see a movie about the battle of Baltimore, the flag and the National Anthem. *Ft. McHenry is a National Park and as such charges admission. Please bring your National Parks Pass if you have one and we can save some money here.* We will watch the flag ceremony and possibly the firing of the canon. At 1130 we'll board the buses for the Baltimore Inner Harbor. Here you will be on your own for lunch, shopping or touring the Historic Ships in Baltimore. The ship tours are separate and you buy your tickets at the kiosk at the Harbor. The ships include: USS Constellation, launched in 1854, the last all sail ship built by the Navy and still afloat that saw

service in the Civil War; US Coast Guard Cutter Taney, launched in 1936, she is the last surviving warship afloat today from the December 7, 1941 attack on Pearl Harbor; USS Torsk, who sunk the last enemy warship torpedoed at the end of World War II on August 14, 1945; and Lightship 116 Chesapeake, commissioned in 1930, served in the Chesapeake Bay as a navigation aid. The buses will pick us up at 1600 (4 pm) at the Inner Harbor and return us to The



Westin. Lunch is on your own. This tour will be limited to the <u>first 94 persons</u> to sign up.

Friday Night Theme Dinner

This evening we will have our casual dress Friday night Theme Dinner starting at 1800. The theme for this year is to wear something representing your state flag. The dinner will be a buffet featuring Herb Roasted Chicken, Seared Flat Iron Steak, Penne Pasta with Marinara or Bolognese sauces with salad and vegetables. There will be a cash bar. *Note: The annual Saturday night raffle and auction will follow the Friday Night's dinner to allow more time for the Saturday night banquet activities.*

Saturday, October 27 – Business Meeting, Ladies Silent Auction, and Formal Banquet

IN TRIBUTE---By Past President, Rod Keith

It is always difficult to say goodbye to shipmates. This past year our Strauss family lost several members. Two of them were well known by many of us as they were the original founders of the USS Joseph Strauss Association. Lawrence Layman (The Admiral) and Orlo Bartholomew (Chief Bart) made things happen. Both of these men were seasoned, old-school professional Navy men. Coming of age in the Korean war, they had served on combat surface ships and knew of the potential dangers facing their ship and crew. My first encounter with them took place in 1968 when I reported for duty as a 19 year old RDSN (E3). Chief Bart was my new boss, and Commander Layman was our CO. They had similar beliefs in that knowledge, teamwork and endurance were the keys to success, and perhaps survival. Both pushed their young charges to be better every single time a duty was performed. I remember going to general quarters six times in one 24 hour period. The Captain wanted his crew to be ready for the REAL thing and the Chief was his right-hand man. We repeated the exercise over and over again until every member of the crew knew his job and what was expected. Many of us boarded the Strauss as boot camp sailors, but returned safely as real Navy men thanks to the dedication and leadership of these incredible men and others like them.

My service connection to Admiral Layman and Chief Bart lasted a little over a year and a half, but the lessons I learned under their mentorship have lasted a lifetime. Many years had passed,



and by chance in 1991 a customer mentioned to me that he noticed a small posting in the Navy Times of an upcoming Strauss reunion planned in Ludington, Michigan. Had it not been for two free tickets (that were about to expire) on Southwest Airlines my destiny in this Association would have been

vastly different than reality. I had no idea what I was walking into, who would be there and if I would know anyone at all. Imagine my shock when my wife, Brenda, and I found ourselves with 5 other Strauss sailors...one of which was

Admiral Layman and another Chief Bart. Being the junior man there, I was pretty sure I would soon be doing a fire watch at the hotel or worse. That did not happen. We were greeted with the warmest handshakes and smiles. In addition to reminiscing about Strauss events, the Admiral and Chief Bart put



into motion the formation of our Association. It is because of their actions that we have been

able to renew old friendships and bonds, as well as lifelong connections. I have been fortunate enough to attend all 20 plus reunions, and like most of our members, count this Association as one of the biggest blessings in my life.

Even though it is tough saying goodbye to Admiral Layman and Chief Bart, they will always be a part of each of us. Both remarked many times of their pride in this Association and its members. Thank you both for a job well done. We will strive to make you proud. Rest in peace shipmates. We have the watch!

A Special Thank You

As most of you already know our Webmaster, Ray Berilla, is confined to a wheelchair. In 1970 he was a vibrant and hustling Boatswain Mate aboard Strauss. Over the years some of the atrocities of life have caught up with many of us but Ray has had to deal with Muscular Dystrophy. Ray also received nerve damage from a brain tumor and a spinal cord tumor. This damage is painful especially in his hands which makes typing an ordeal.

Ray has fought hard for his shipmates by researching the Strauss deck logs and making them available via our website for shipmates that need them. Ray fills each deck log request by going to his computer, building a CD, and packing and mailing that CD. He keeps abreast of Agent Orange related developments and reports to his shipmates' actions taken that help provide proof to the VA for filing claims. Ray is the one responsible for getting the Strauss listed on the VA Agent Orange ship register.

Ray has attended many of our reunions. It is not easy for a person confined to a 200 pound wheelchair to transit airports, airplanes, shuttle buses, and tour buses. Ray has been stranded in airport concourses because his wheelchair battery has gone dead. There are many more examples of how hard life is when you are confined to a wheel chair.

Ray lives in Florida, a state with many wonderful beaches---beaches that are not accessible by wheelchair. Ray has dreamed about going to the beach just like he did many years ago in Hawaii. He dreams of traveling nature trails and fishing for the big one. He also wanted to get a drone but was concerned that "I might not be able to get it if it went down in an area that I couldn't get to…" Ray's life is about to change.

Late last year Kimberly Box called to discuss an idea that she had. I think a lot of you know

Kim from Facebook but many don't know that Kim was a former MM3 on the USS Pyro and was married to Rick Engels---a deceased Strauss shipmate. Kim wanted to do something for Ray---she wanted to get him a tracked wheelchair. Kim had discussed this with her mother, Delores. Delores decided to make a generous donation to the *Independence Fund* with the stipulation that they would provide a chair for Ray. Kim says that "Making this kind of donation is always an honor, but it meant even more, knowing it's going to someone we know and a part of the Strauss family". Ray received his new chair on Feb 21, 2018. These



chairs can be fitted with different options. Note here that Ray chose a fishing pole holder.
